Peemaï draws its roots from the traditional music of Southeast Asia – from Laos to Indonesia – as much as from the energy of urban cultures that inspire its four musicians. Their music, free and boundless, blends hypnotic rhythms, catchy melodies, and reinvented traditional songs with joyful boldness and a refined sense of improvisation. Each concert is a vibrant and generous experience, driven by a powerful groove and a jubilant sense of togetherness.

Molam – the rural blues of Laos – meets electronic grooves and rock textures, while the pulse of Javanese gamelan collides with sounds reminiscent of Hendrix or Coltrane. Peemaï forges a unique musical fusion at the crossroads of Asian music, jazz, rock, and electronic sounds.

PEEMAÏ: FROM ITS CREATION TO ITS FIRST ASIAN TOURS AND DEBUT SELF-TITLED ALBUM!

Formed in 2016 at the Scène Nationale de Sète, Peemaï quickly embarked on their first tour in Southeast Asia, with their debut concert taking place at the Vientiane Jazz Festival in Laos.

In 2017, enriched by their experiences and a collaboration with Laotian musicians, they recorded their first self-titled album, co-produced by Shreds Records and Collectif Koa, distributed by L'Autre Distribution. The album was widely acclaimed by the press (FFF Télérama, "ÉLU" Citizen Jazz, Jazz News Album of the Month), marking the beginning of a long series of concerts...

GAGA GUNDUL - THE INDONESIAN JOURNEY AND THE ENCOUNTER WITH GAMELAN

Driven by a thirst for discovery and musical encounters, the four members of Peemaï traveled to Yogyakarta, on the island of Java, in 2019 to study traditional gamelan. There, they met the Javanese music collective Gayam 16. Together, they created a new repertoire, premiered at the Guimet Museum of Asian Arts in 2022, which was then performed throughout France and Indonesia that same year.

This collaboration gave birth to Peemai's second album, Gaga Gundul, released in April 2024. The album highlights the sounds of Javanese gamelan, whose tones, rhythms, and textures converse with percussive grooves, electronic layers, improvised breaths, and rock energy. The record was praised by critics and named "Jazz Album of the Week" by FIP.

With the aim of promoting gamelan, Indonesian culture, and cross-cultural musical fusion, Peemaï has also developed an educational and cultural outreach component around this project. Masterclasses, gamelan discovery workshops, musical encounters, and educational sessions enrich the audience's experience and help spread awareness of these musical practices, still little-known in Europe.

PEEMAÏ - TOURING ASIA AND BEYOND

Peemaï is a true globetrotting band with a particular fondness for touring in Asia. Since 2016, they've performed in Laos, Cambodia, China, Thailand, Malaysia, and Singapore – returning in 2019, 2022, and again in 2025 – continually expanding their international presence and deepening their commitment to blending aesthetics and cultures.

In June 2025, Peemaï will perform at the iconic Rainforest World Music Festival in Kuching (Malaysia), one of Asia's largest world music festivals, marking a major milestone in the international development of their project.

Peemaï will continue its exploration of Southeast Asian music with a third repertoire currently in development. After immersing themselves in the musical traditions of Laos and Indonesia, the group now sets its sights on a new horizon: the music of the Khmer Empire.

Rather than focusing on the borders of a modern nation, Peemaï is delving into the repertoires and musical influences that flowed through this vast civilization, paving the way for a bold and inspiring new fusion.

Hugues Mayot

Hugues Mayot is a saxophonist and clarinetist from the Lorraine region of France. After studying at the conservatories of Metz and Strasbourg, as well as at the Paris Conservatoire (CNSM), he was recruited by Marc Ducret to join his large ensemble Le Sens de la Marche. From that point on, he multiplied collaborations across jazz, improvised, and traditional music scenes. He currently composes and performs with his two own projects as a leader: What if?, alongside Jozef Dumoulin, Franck Vaillant, and Joachim Florent, and L'Arbre Rouge, with Théo and Valentin Ceccaldi, Joachim Florent, and Sophie Bernado. He is also a member of several other projects, including Que Vola? by Fidel Fourneyron, Roots Quartet by Pierre Durand, Spring Roll by Sylvaine Hélary, Gleizkrew by Philippe Gleizes, and Beps by Bertrand Beruard.



Gilles Coronado

Gilles Coronado, based in Paris since 1991, is a chameleon-like guitarist. He was part of the emerging new improvised music scene in the 1990s, centered around the club Les Instants Chavirés. In 1994, he founded the group Urban Mood. He also performs with Sarah Murcia's band Caroline, and collaborates with contemporary dance artists such as Mathilde Monnier, Catherine Contour, Thierry Baë, and Loïc Touzé. He has recorded with Katerine & Francis et ses Peintres.

A versatile musician, Coronado also works on radio fiction projects for France Culture, musical creations such as Tephra Formations at the Centre Pompidou (a piece by Philippe Katerine and designer Robert Stadler), and music programs for ARTE.



Alfred Vilavleck

Alfred began his musical journey at the age of 12, inspired by rock music and especially Jimi Hendrix. He quickly turned to jazz and improvisation. A graduate of the conservatories of Perpignan and Strasbourg, he performed with various jazz ensembles before founding the Collectif Koa in Montpellier in 2008, which led to collaborations with Steve Coleman, Aka Moon, Magic Malik, and Jim Black.

A versatile accompanist and globetrotting musician, he has had the pleasure of playing with Serge Lazarévitch, Joël Allouche, Jeroen Van Herzeele, Julien Lourau, John Tchicaï, Pierre Van Dormael, and Cherif Soumano. He currently leads the Grand Ensemble Koa and contributes to several groups including Gratitude Trio, Peemaï, Kunzit, and more recently Nefertiti, an illustrated concert for young audiences. Alfred also teaches jazz at the Montpellier Conservatory and leads numerous Soundpainting projects.



Maxime Rouayroux

An intuitive and sensitive drummer, Maxime was drawn to improvisation and sound exploration from an early age. While dedicated to developing his own musical language, he enjoys navigating a wide range of musical expressions. He is involved in numerous jazz and improvised music projects of all kinds (Malboro Bled, Synestet, Fur, Ouroboros), and also has a strong interest in traditional music (Syrto, La Guiguinche). He is a founding member of the indie rock band Volin.

From Montpellier to Brussels via Paris, Maxime has carved out his path alongside many musicians such as Fred Gastard, Bruno Ducret, Guilhem Verger, Hervé Duret, Benjamin Sauzereau, Hélène Duret, Sylvain Debaisieux, Hasse Poulsen, Thomas Letellier, Nicolas Stephan, Louis Prado, Chloé Lucas, and many more.


